We have 119 full plots divided into a total of 190 third/half or full plots with 171 tenants.

8.1	Ban the use of sprinklers - Proposed by Sue Hollington and seconded by Jo
8.2	Mingham The chair gave some examples of problems encountered throughout the
8.3	summer - amount of water used, the cost of wasted water and how this affects other plot holder by stopping others using water. FT then raised concern regarding the amount of water used and further pointed out the complaints made and reports from various members. FT explained in some detail the complaints there had been, especially incidents of a sprinkler being left on for three quarters of an hour while someone went home for lunch. It was then brought up that there were occasions of somebody attaching a hose, leaving it unattended on their plot and others then having problems because of no water availability. The chair then opened this subject for debate by the membership. A full and frank discussion ensued where a number of proposals and counter proposals were raised and full consideration was given to all suggestions and this included both hosepipe use and sprinklers. During the discussion it was stated that the meeting was required to vote on the proposed amendment. It was proposed by Jo Mingham and seconded by Martin Lewis that Members cannot leave water running and walk away from the plot or leave a hosepipe unattended for any length of time A vote was taken on banning sprinklers and unattended hosepipes. This was passed by a majority decision with there being one person opposed to the
	change.
