The A.G.M. was held on the 29<sup>th</sup> October at 11.30 a.m. outside the hut and although the attendance was not staggering it was more than sufficient to hold the meeting. You never know, perhaps next year we may have a better turnout. Anyway, for those of you who could not attend, the usual format was followed; the Chair of the A.G.M. gave a brief introduction and went on (and on and on) before introducing the main participants

who would present their reports. This included the Secretary, Membership Secretary and Treasurer who all gave statements to the meeting.

# **Secretary's Report**

The Secretary outlined the events and achievements this year including:-

The Secretary also went on to advise the meeting regarding upcoming events and improvements to the site including:-


- Renewal of the last two gates (dependent on grant money)

The Secretary also reported on the waiting list and how this has been managed this year. The current number of people on the waiting list is 38. The site has been full all year, from last July until this month where vacancies may occur due to non-payment of rent but that these will be let as soon as possible.

The Secretary also gave thanks to all who have helped with last year's achievements and all that will (hopefully) help to make next year just as successful.

# **Membership Secretary's Report**



The Membership Secretary reported that we have 119 plots on the site and these are sub-divided to create 188 plots. There have been 9 vacant plots this year and these have been re-let with virtually no rent loss.

The Membership Secretary complimented the Lettings Officer on the efficient way the plots have been re-let. He went on to remind everyone at the meeting that this year's rent is to be paid by the 11<sup>th</sup> November 2016. All rents not paid before this date has to be paid for by the Association.

The Membership Secretary stated that we should collect £5,500.00 this year and of this Leeds City Council will receive £3,300.00 leaving a balance of £2,200.00 for the Association.

The Membership Secretary also gave thanks to everyone on the site who helped make his job easier, by delivering letters to plot holders who do not use email and others who (and they know who they are) who are essential in the running of the site.

# Treasurer's Report



The Treasurer's report was delayed until the outcome of the 6<sup>th</sup> Race at Ascot was known.....


The Treasurer circulated a separate report and queries regarding the format of the said report were answered. See document. BMAA accounts 12 - 15 (this is available on the website).

The treasurer went through the individual items in the report and also added a number of points, the main one being that, although the savings we have do look quite healthy, we do need to keep a working balance of £3,500.00 to repay key deposits.

However, although it is nice to be solvent and to have savings, we do not intend to keep increasing them year on year and requested ideas as to how



the members of the Association wanted the site improving. If there are any enhancements that would upgrade or develop the site in any way, then please



#### **Election of Officers**

At this point the outgoing Committee resigned and a new one was elected. The new Committee and Trustees are listed on the first page of the newsletter.

# **Changes to the Rules**

There were 2 proposed changes to the rules; the first after some discussion, had a new clause added and reads as follows

5.9 Each greenhouse left by an outgoing plot holder becomes the property of B.M.A.A. and that this will be leased to the new tenant at a cost of £10.00 per two foot run up to a maximum of £60.00. This payment is a lease and not a deposit no payment will be refunded. All payments must be made prior to taking the second of the control o



deposit no payment will be refunded. All payments must be made prior to taking up the new tenancy. All structures left on site are B.M.A.A. property and may be leased at their discretion, with the exception of a tenant transferring to a new plot or taking on an additional plot, where a payment has been made to the outgoing tenant.

The other Rule change is

7.11 On termination of their tenancy, plot holders are only able to claim the deposit for keys that are currently valid. No deposits will be refunded for "OLD" keys.

Both changes were agreed unanimously at the meeting and have now been added to the rules of the Association.

# **Any Other Business**



A number of items were discussed including participation in the Yellow Book Scheme as well as holding an "Open Day" for "National Allotments Week" - it was felt that the National Allotments



Week is too near to the Show to participate. As for the "Yellow Book Scheme" it could already be too late for 2017 but it was agreed to look into this for 2018 and report back at next year's A.G.M. regarding this. It was

proposed by HW and seconded by FT that the plant sale in June should be held as an open day this was discussed and agreed that with additional publicity that this could be achievable. This was agreed unanimously.



# **Any Other Business**

A discussion was also held regarding visitors to the Annual Show strolling around and eating produce - it was agreed that signs will be put up on the gates and in the Show area to discourage people from this dastardly practice next year.



Then, just as we thought it was all over.....There were just a few more people to say "thank you" to and at last that was it, it really was all over. There were some people on the pitch and before we knew it the whole sordid affair was over and done with again for another year.

## More Thanks from Us to You

# **Grants and Funding**

We recently applied for a grant from Wade's Charity, to explain a little about them Wade's Charity originated in 1530 during the reign of Henry VIII when Thomas Wade left money in his will, which has since been added to by others, for the benefit of the people of Leeds. Now managed by a Trust - the monies produce an income, from



which grants are offered to Leeds based charities and community groups. The Trust also owns many open spaces in Leeds such as Gotts Park and Middleton Park.

We have in the last few years received funding from the charity to renew the gates to the site. The latest bid for funding is to replace the last two gates on Beechwood Crescent and Lumley Place. We recently had a visit from a member of the charity's committee and explained what we have done in the past and what we required the grant for. We hope to know more about this in December after the trustees of the charity next meet.
