Staging

Entries should be staged by 10.00 a.m. on the day of the Show, this is to give the judges time to get round all the entries and give them due consideration prior to the opening of the show, which will be at 2.00 p.m.

The format is that on Saturday, you can register your entries (see opening

times). Then on the Sunday, the day of the Show, you bring them along and display them for judging. Help and advice will be available both days, so don't be afraid to ask and enter your produce. You will find hints and tips on the website.

Help If You Need It

If you're not sure how to display anything, we do have a number of guidance sheets, available on the Website and on the Notice Boards outside the hut, but don't be afraid to ask, we want to help you, and we are always there give advice and assistance should you need it. Collection for Foodbank

At this year's Show we will be having a collection point for any surplus produce you may have. This will then be distributed to local food charities. Any entries left from the Show and not used in the auction will also be added. If you wish to bring along any other items on the day then we encourage you to do so.

Site Security

No this is not the usual tirade about locking the gates; we have recently had several reports of vandalism on the site and although we have over the years tried



to help improve security to reduce the number of break-ins and vandalism to the site it still happens. We try our best to protect the site, and as such your property, against unauthorised people

entering the site and causing damage so please be aware what's going on and be vigilant. Please report any damage or vandalism directly to the police. We have requested that the police increase their patrols of the area and we hope that this will

have an affect on the situation. So for your own and others safety please be conscious about who you allow in. A good rule of thumb is if you do not know them and they do not have a key then you probably should not be letting them in. Again, with safety in mind, please let people know (your family or friends), where you are. If you are at the allotments alone, for your own saftey, always carry a mobile phone with you in case of an emergency.

Plot Inspections



Plot inspections started in April and have been carried out every four to five weeks thereafter these will continue throughout the growing season. Inspections are undertaken to ascertain the state of the site as well as individual plots. Health and safety issues will also be noted and plot holders may be contacted to address any concerns identified. **All plots are inspected, there is no opt out.**

The criterion used is as follows:-

- Condition of the hedge (where applicable)
- Condition of the path
- Plot Number Sign
- Weeds and uncultivated areas
- Accumulation of rubbish on the plot
- Percentage of cultivated areas

Plots will be also be assessed using the following criteria:-

- E = Excellent,
- G = Good,
- P = Poor
- U = Unacceptable



All plots that have areas that are found to be unacceptable or poor will be notified by the Secretary.

Plot Judging

Plot judging will continue in the next few weeks. This is ONLY to be used to decide the winners of this year's best plot holder's competitions at the Annual Show. This is separate from plot inspections, and each plot is judged twice, usually in July and again in August, and each plot is scored, with points awarded for the path, general condition of the plot and condition of crops. The plot judging is used for the Annual Show and there is a trophy awarded each year for the Best Plot and Best Half



Plot. Details of the criteria for judging are set out below and are also on the Notice Board. However, a small number of plot holders have expressed a wish that their plots are not judged. If you do not want your plot to be judged, in this way, please let us know. There will be a notice on the board outside the hut, to which you can add your name.

Leeds Coppice Workers

We have invited Leeds Coppice Workers to the Annual Show where you can meet with their representatives and discus with them their aims and objectives and perhaps purchase some of their products. These include Bean Poles, Pea Sticks and Garden Stakes. A number of plot holders ordered some of their products earlier this year and we hope this will give more of you a chance to meet with them. Cut from local woodlands in a traditional form of woodland management known as coppicing. Britain lost 90% of its coppice woodlands in the 20th Century so by using these bean poles you will be supporting the restoration and care of a rich wildlife habitat, rural jobs and helping



to keep ancient skills and traditions alive. In addition to all this they look good and may provide better grip for your beans.

Should you wish for us to provide these, or any other products that you know of, or for that matter anything else that you want (within reason). Then contact us at the Trading Hut and we will do our best to get them for you, and at a more than reasonable price. We currently stock a number of items such as peat free compost a whole range of fertilisers as well as grow bags and the like. 
