Beanpoles

National Beanpole Week 2017 (8th-16th April) will celebrate Britain's coppiced woodlands, the animals and plants that live in them, the coppice workers who look after them and the beanpoles and other coppice wood products they produce. Cut from local woodlands in a traditional form of woodland management known as coppicing. Britain lost 90% of its coppice woodlands in the 20th Century so by using these bean poles you will be supporting the restoration and care of a rich wildlife habitat, rural jobs and helping to keep ancient skills and traditions alive. In addition to all this they look good and may provide better grip for your beans

Yes this is a real thing (check out the Website http://www.beanpoles.org.uk/).

"Beanpoles are useful. Beanpoles are beautiful. Beanpoles are completely sustainable. What is more every beanpole we use in our gardens contributes to the conservation of the rich but fragile coppice ecosystem. "- Monty Don

We mentioned last year that we would try to get some samples from Leeds Coppice Workers; their products include Bean Poles, Pea Sticks and Garden Stakes.

We will be inviting them to the Coffee Morning on the 8th April.

If you would be interested in buying some beanpoles from the Leeds Coppice Workers then please sign up your name, number or email and how many poles you would like on the poster which is up on the hut notice board.

- Individual packs of 10 bean poles are £10
- 10-24 packs of beanpoles are £8 per pack
- 25 or more packs are £7 per bundle

Contact Details

It is important that your contact details that we hold are kept up to date; we require these to be able to keep in touch with you in case of an emergency, to be able to send you newsletters, details of upcoming events and your annual invoice.

Home Address



This is the Main Contact details that we put on your invoice, where we send any correspondence regarding plot condition, late or non-payment of invoice.

Email



This is used to keep you updated with information, newsletters, Annual Show, and those who have chosen to have paperless invoicing. You can unsubscribe to this at any time.

Telephone



Used as an emergency contact; in the case of vandalism or if there is any other damage to your plot that you may need to attend to. It would help if you can provide a mobile and home telephone number if you have both.

Not having your up to date contact details could mean that you may lose your plot if important correspondence is sent to the wrong address.

Recycling

Skip

We have arranged a skip on site for the 12th of April; it will be here until it is full. When we have ordered these in the past we have found that it fills up very quickly less than a week.

Kirkstall Household Waste Recycling Site is now open!

As some of you now know the recycling centre at Kirkstall Road has recently reopened, apparently I didn't have to take my bike twice to use it!!!! I took my old batteries though – free of charge.....

Leeds City Council has a permit scheme in operation for the site so make sure you display yours when you call as we hear they're pretty keen.



Materials accepted at the site include:

Cardboard, garden waste, scrap metal, wood, paper, aerosols, foil, glass, hard-core, plasterboard, rubble, soil, textiles, shoes, books, engine oil, vegetable oil, TVs and monitors, fridges and freezers, electrical appliances, mobile phones, household batteries, fluorescent

tubes, energy saving bulbs, printer cartridges, car batteries, tyres (4 max), paint, household/DIY chemicals, furniture, mattresses and garden chemicals.

Please note that for one off visits, we can only accept up to **five** rubble sacks (25kg standard type) or one small car boot load per visit of soil, inert or rubble waste.

New Revive Leeds Re-use shop

The purpose built Revive Leeds Re-use shop (tel. 0113 216 3310) is also situated at this site, and has its own car park. Pedestrian access is via the gate from Evanston Avenue.

The re-use shop is the second to be developed in Leeds and is run by Revive Leeds, a community interest group made up of two local charities: SLATE and SVP. Any re-usable items such as furniture, working electrical items, clothing, bikes, toys, books, cd's, bric-a-brac and other household items can be donated direct to the new Revive Leeds re-use shop, where donations can be sold at low prices and enjoyed by someone else.

The shop is open all year round, seven days a week, 9am to 3:30pm (GMT) and 9am to 5:30pm (BST) except for Christmas Eve, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
