## **Nature Watch**

This article is to introduce the Burley Model Allotments Association "Nature Watch" scheme. For those of you who have been keeping up with recent goings-on at the site this is a scheme that has been discussed at the last two Annual General Meetings. For those of you who haven't been keeping up, this should explain all.

It was proposed a couple of years ago to set up a scheme to monitor the wildlife on the plot and although this is a very laudable sentiment it has taken some time to come to fruition as these things have a habit of doing, well at least until someone is pressed into doing all the work. Well luckily for us David has stepped in to lend a hand. We are hoping to set up an online presence but in the meantime, if you have any questions or would like to help contact David Benn at <u>bmaanw@gmail.com</u>



So have you ever wondered about the wildlife on the allotments? Perhaps you have seen a rare or interesting bird, and thought about contacting the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds (RSPB) or the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO) to find out more?



BMAA has set up a nature watch group, and starting from February we will be

regularly recording wildlife seen on (and over!) the site. The group is very keen to hear from all plot holders; you will be able to write your sightings on a notice board outside the hut, and eventually send them in online. We will of course keep you up to date on this initiative through the newsletters as well.

> We welcome any level of detail, and photos would be a big bonus. We will even try to help with identification if needed.

Other plans include setting up bat and bird boxes, bird feeders close to the hut, and inviting groups such as West Yorkshire Bat Group to carry out

specific onsite surveys. Group volunteers will gather and share all data with national conservation and academic bodies. We are already in touch with Yorkshire Wildlife Trust, Leeds Nats and RSPB. Group members have already carried out several 'practice' surveys and have recorded several interesting birds including Jay and Woodcock. And many of you will remember the flock of Waxwings that took up residence last winter.







## **Nature Watch**

This shows that our allotments are an important green area amid dense housing, but are also close to green corridors and the open spaces in the Kirkstall valley. As ever the success of this project will depend on the number of members of the association who contribute to the scheme.

#### Water for the site 2018

Last summer, our water bill was more than double the bill for the summer of 2016. As it was not such a dry summer, it would appear that something has changed: people are leaving taps running after they have filled up and the water butt is full, people are watering a lot more than in previous years, or there is a leak.





## So what can we do about it?

We've asked Yorkshire Water to install a

modern meter, so we can take readings quickly and easily, and will take monthly readings over the summer .As the water is switched off for the winter, we can't investigate the possibility of a leak until it comes on again at Easter - we'll ask someone to come in then to see if they can find a leak. So when the water is back on can all of you be super vigilant about taps running and overflowing water butts, and

think whether you do need to use a lot of water on your plot. Obviously, if the water bill continues at this level, we will have to increase the amount we all pay for water, so it's everyone's problem. Thanks for your help

## **Contact Details**

It is important that your contact details we hold are kept up to date. We require these to be able to keep in touch with you in case of an emergency, to be able to send you newsletters, details of upcoming events and your annual invoice. It is also a means of knowing that you are who you say you are. In these days of identity fraud it is imperative that you keep us up to date with your details. We need to know if you have changed any of the following details in the last 12 months.



**Home Address** This is the Main Contact details that we put on your invoice, where we send any correspondence regarding plot condition, late or non-payment of invoice.

**Email** This is used to keep you updated with information, Newsletters, the Annual Show and A.G.M. This is also used for those of you who have chosen to have paperless invoicing. You can unsubscribe to this at any time.

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**Telephone** Used as an emergency contact; in the case of vandalism or if there is any other damage to your plot that you may need to attend to. It would help if you can provide a mobile and home telephone number if you have both.

Not having your up to date contact details could mean that you may lose your plot if important correspondence is sent to the wrong address.
